Like many households and businesses, Randolph County is currently facing the significant impact of rising fuel prices. To maintain fiscal responsibility and ensure the long-term stability of our local budget, the County is evaluating necessary adjustments to daily operations and public services.

Potential Changes to County Services

Residents may notice a shift in how the County conducts business. While our primary goal remains providing high-quality essential services, the following measures are currently under consideration to offset increased fuel expenditures:

- **Road Maintenance:** Citizens may see a decrease in the frequency of motor grader operations on secondary roads.
- **Landscaping & Beautification:** Grass cutting and roadside mowing schedules may be reduced or spaced further apart.
- **Office Operations:** Some County offices may implement modified schedules, including potential closures on specific days of the week, to reduce facility energy use and commute-related fuel consumption.
